

- ✓ You will receive an email to pick up your access card from the service center automatically when registered in ladok.
- ✓ Printing, copying, opening doors on campus

Mecenat card

- ✓ Digital student card the only one valid in Sweden as a student ID http://mecenat.com
- ✓ Contact the student union about becoming a member and how to get your card

**Remember: you are not eligible for student discounts on the buses/trains until you have a Mecenat card. If you do not have one and you purchase the discounted tickets, you could be subject to a fine if you get caught by the ticket control (biljettkontroll).

Insurance

- Insurance as an incoming student registration in Ladok activates the insurance

Insurance

- During study hours, all students are covered by the personal injury insurance for students via Kammarkollegiet. Fee-paying studens are covered by FAS+
- All exchange students are covered by the personal injury insurance Student IN insurance. You can read the full terms of the insurance on the Kammarkollegiet website
- Registration in Ladok activates the insurance
- If you have European citizenship, you should have the blue EU insurance card, which guarantees you the same prices as a Swedish citizen would pay.
- If you need to submit an insurance claim, you pay first and then submit your receipts
 for reimbursement with a form on Kammarkollegiet's website (SAVE YOUR
 RECEIPTS!), Mobility Team will help you with this.





If you get sick...

- Let your course leader know if you have to miss class
- Call 1177 (1177.se) for medical advice
- Go to your local health clinic (vårdcentral)
- For emergencies (akut), call 112 or o to the hospital (sjukhus)
- If you need to go back to your home country for health reasons, contact the Mobility Team




STAGES of CULTURE SHOCK
