



Level abbreviations

Bachelor's level (first-cycle)

- G1N
- G1F
- G2F
- G2E (bachelor thesis)

Master's level (second-cycle)

- A1N
- A1F
- A2E (master thesis)

A programme consist of courses. Each course has a level. The level describe the dept of a course, for example:

G1N: First-cycle level, with only upper secondary entry requirements **G2F:** First-cycle level, require a minimum of 60 academic credits

A1N: Second-cycle level, with only first-cycle course(s) as entry requirement

The level of a course is visible in the course's syllabus.





Credit system

- 1,5 credits = 1 week full time studies (100%)
- 7,5 credits = 5 weeks
- 15 credits = 10 weeks (half semester)
- 30 credits = 20 weeks, one semester
- 1 credit = 1 ECTS

Full time studies means full time studies. Don't expect to work at the same time as you study, not more than marginally. My experience is that students that work a lot besides their studies don't pass their courses to the same extent as students who don't work a lot.

How many credits a course contains is visible in the course syllabus.



One course at the time (normally)

- Normally, a course at SLU comprise 15 credits or 7,5 credits
- One course at the time (exeptions exist)
- Examinations vary from course to course. One examination in the end of a course or several examinations during a course.

Examinations can be written exams, home exams, seminars, laborations, papers, etc.

For information about examinations, please see the course schedule or ask the couse leader.





Grading scales at SLU

- 5 (pass with special distinction)
- 4 (pass with credit)
- 3 (pass)
- U (fail)
- G (pass)
- U (fail)

There are two different grading scales at SLU. The upper one is the most common: 5, 4, 3 and U. Some courses or course modules are exempt from this scale, then a two-point grading scale is used: G and U.

If you have passed a course, it is not possible to do the exam again to receive a higher grade. If you have failed, you are of course allowed to do re-examination. But after a certain amount of re-examinations it is not possible to receive higher grade than 3. For more information, please see the grading criterias for each course on the course webpage or contact the course leader.





Prerequisites/entry requirements/prior learning

- Each course has its own requirements. Make sure you fulfill the requirements.
- You are not always automatically eligible for all courses in your programme.
- Look ahead. Will you fulfill the requirements for future courses?
- The requirement for a course are visible in the course syllabus.



Apply for courses



- Students admitted to a programme are automatically admitted to the courses in first semester.
- Following semesters: Apply even if admitted to programme. Information meeting 24 September.
- Courses in your programme.
- Courses outside your programme (special rules for fee-paying students and students with SI or SLU scholarship).
- Make sure you fulfil the degree requirements in the end.

The majority or the students follow the courses that are included in their programme.

But it is possible to study courses from outside your programme if the course is offered as an independent course. Note that there are special rules for fee-paying students and students with SI or SLU scholarship.
