Scholarships

- The few recipients of the SLU Scholarship have been notified.
- If you have applied for the Swedish Institute scholarship (SI) you will receive a reply on 28 April.
- Swedish Institute scholarship covers tuition fees and living costs.
- No scholarship opportunities for upcoming semesters



Pay the tuition fees

- Fee paying students have received an e-mail from tuitionfees@slu.se with instructions about how to pay the tuition fees.
- Contact tuitionfees@slu.se if you can't find the e-mail (check your spam box first)
- Deadline to pay tuition fees = June 1
- Ok to pay in other currencies (e.g. US dollar and EURO)
- EU/EEA and Swiss citizens do not have to pay any tuition fees.

Residence permit for higher education

- Residence permit for higher education Swedish Migration Agency. www.migrationsverket.se/English
- You must pay the tuition fees before you can apply for a residence permit.
- How to speed up the process
 - Pay the fee and apply as early as possible
 - Provide the correct information and documents
- You must be able to show that you can support yourself (SEK 8694 per month).
 - SEK 104,328 (12 x SEK 8 694)
 - Partner must have: SEK 43,470 (12 x SEK 3,622.50)
 - Children: SEK 26,082 (12 x SEK 2,173.50)

Residence permit for higher education

- Fee-paying students are covered by the personal injury insurance for students and the FAS+ policy by SLU. Attach your notification of selection results as evidence of health insurance when you apply for residence permit
- Citizens from an EU/EEA country or Switzerland do NOT have to apply for a residence permit.



Conditionally admitted

- Conditions must be fulfilled no later than two weeks after the programme starts
- Upload your qualifying degree diploma on www.universityadmissions.se
- Notify the Admission Office of SLU, when your diploma is uploaded <u>admissions@slu.se</u>



Housing

- Fee-paying students are guaranteed housing for yourself
 Note: You need to pay for the housing yourself
 even if you are guaranteed housing
- Other students need to arrange housing on their own

Random facts about Sweden

- 1,572km from North to South
- The fifth largest country in Europe
- 30 national parks
- 69% covered with trees
- 7% agricultural land
- 3% urban and industrial land
- 10,452,326 million people
- Sami = indigenous people
- 5 official national minorities
- Arabic is the second most spoken language
- 6 June official national day
- Stockholm, Gothenburg, Malmö





Life in Sweden

- Four seasons and different climates and landscapes depending on where you are.
- Very dark vs. very light months
- Fika = Pastry/cookies + coffee/tea
- Biking is an easy and cheap way to get around as a student.
- Joining associations, organisations or clubs = way to get to know Swedes.
- Right of public access (Allemansrätten) → Being out in nature and hiking are common activities.

Money, money, money...

- High costs of living minimum SEK 8694 per month (very cheap lifestyle)
- It will be challenging to study and work at the same time in order to cover all expenses.
- Many places and services only accept card payments.
- "I'll swish you"
- Having a Swedish personal identity number will make the process of opening a bank account easier.
